NOISE Summer School 2013: Naturecultures in Feminist Academia, Art and Activism

Utrecht University

What: The NOISE Summer School is organized by the Netherlands Research School of Genderstudies (NOG, Utrecht University). The 2013 edition is coordinated by dr. Iris van der Tuin, prof. dr. Maaïke Bleeker (both Utrecht University) and Liu Xin, MA (Åbo Akademi, Finland). Several renowned scholars and practitioners from various disciplines will be teaching at the Summer School: dr. Arun Saldanha (Lancaster University, UK), dr. Niamh Moore (Manchester University, UK), dr. Milla Tiainen (Anglia Ruskin University, UK) and Jan van den Berg (Performing Arts and Science) amongst others. This advanced training course offers a diversified yet coherent programme of study from an interdisciplinary perspective. Special PHD seminars will be coordinated by Prof dr. Rosemarie Buikema.

Date: 26 – 30 August, 2013.

Location: Utrecht, NL.

Subject: This year's (the 21st) edition of NOISE will introduce cutting edge scholarship at the crossroads of gender studies, performance studies and philosophy of science. We will take the concept of 'naturecultures', established by Donna Haraway in the Companion Species Manifesto (2003), as our starting point. By investigating selected scholarly as well as cultural practices, we aim at using this conceptual tool so as to sharpen our understanding of the blurred boundaries between gendered oppositional pairs such as active and passive, body and mind.

Doing Gender Lecture Series Spring 2013

The lecture of Dr. Kirby at Maastricht on April 5 will be during lunch time. The lecture May 21 is from 16.00–18.00 hrs at Utrecht University.

What: In the spring of 2013 the Netherlands Research School of Genderstudies (NOG) in cooperation with Graduate Gender Programme (GGeP) at Utrecht University organises a tenth round of the series of lectures entitled DOING GENDER. This title stresses the importance of doing gender work and active involvement in the practice of gender theory and research. It supports a hands-on approach to gender issues in the sense of social and political engagement with the new forms of gender inequalities that are taking shape in the world today. The lecture series wants to give space to the new generations of gender theorists and practitioners and to perspectives that innovate the field and do gender in new ways.

Key is the notion of doing gender: what is the state of the art definition of gender? How do contemporary scholars utilise this definition?

PEN, Postcolonial Europe Network: 'Postcolonial Transitions in Europe: Conflict, Transitional Justice and Cosmopolitanism'

Date: 18-19 April, 2013.
Location: Utrecht University.

What: The PEN conference focuses on the relevance of postcolonial theories for the understanding of world-systemic transformations and the shifts in geopolitics in terms of conflict, transitional justice and cosmopolitanism, by examining the narrative that walks the line between, before and after, memory and truth, compensation and reconciliation, justice and peace.

Subject: In order to tackle the new crises that plague Europe and beyond, this conference will bring together the complementary and synergizing expertise of postcolonial scholars who work across different disciplinary fields such as conflict studies, law, ethics, memory studies, human rights and international relations as well as the arts, visual culture, music and digital platforms. The goal is to inform a new wave of young scholars and academics on how to assess the emergencies and transitions of the present through an ability to acknowledge the working of the past and rethink Europe as a new possible cosmopolitan space. Some of the participants will examine communities ravaged by colonialism and the harm that colonial and postcolonial economic and social disparities cause.

In the last decades, feminist philosophies have made a fruitful exercise of self-criticism.

This criticism has helped dismantle and unmask both the monolithic and hegemonic models of personal identity that pervade in our societies and the normative conceptions of rationality that support these models in an implicit but effective way. This line of thought has also contributed, and still contributes, to account for, and make visible new and different conceptions of human identity and, particularly, of gender identity. As a consequence, many different normative conceptions of rationality and identity have appeared to support them.

The philosophical practice of feminist theory has contributed to the international arena of philosophy with new insights and new approaches. How then can we assess the impact of feminist theories and practices in philosophy and knowledge? This is one of the challenges of this symposium.

Call for papers for ASPASIA 9: Rethinking Empire from Eastern Europe

Deadline: September 15, 2013.

The ASPASIA Editors invite submissions on the theme of gender and empire in Eastern Europe for ASPASIA vol. 9, with Susan Zimmermann (CEU) as guest-editor.

Gendered imperialism within Eastern Europe has received little attention from scholars. We hope this theme section will address this omission and inspire exciting new perspectives on gender and empire in Eastern Europe. We see several particular lacunae in the existing literature. First, while scholars have investigated the entanglement of nation, nationalism, nation-building and gender in Eastern Europe, there is hardly any research on how actors identifying with dominant communities have silently or visibly related to gender, in view of their own and other communities. Second, integrative research into gendered imperialism has been rare in relation to both competing and parallel imperialisms within the region, as well as regarding the consequences of the secondary global status of Eastern European Empires for rethinking empire from Eastern Europe. Third, while there has been an interest in coun-

ter-hegemonic intellectual (populist, socialist, “third-worldist” ...) traditions in East European history, this research has not focused on the gendered dimensions of these intellectual traditions nor on the politics positively related to these intellectual traditions. The history of state-socialist thinking and politics of course forms one important exception, although also in this case the “anti-imperial” dimension of the related gender project has been rather neglected. Fourth, post-empire has more often than not been investigated in terms of national histories or unspecified “entangled” national histories, with ongoing imperial relationships exiled into “context” or altogether absent. Hence, another research lacuna is the gender of post-empire political settings in both national and imperial, and more recently unequally globalized configurations.
