Subject Microeconomics (1st Trimester)

- **For whom?** Students interested in the underlying assumptions of the demand and supply curves of each market, how all the markets fit together (GE) and decision making under risk .
- At the end of the course, student will be able to:
 - understand where the demand curve comes from and the assumptions on consumer behavior that are necessary to get it
 - understand where the supply curve comes from and the corresponding assumptions on producer behavior
 - understand what the theory of decision making under risk implies on human behavior
 - apply consumption theory, production theory and decision making under risk to real life economic problems
 - interpret and discuss critically microeconomics models
- Prerequisites: a minimal knowledge on Microeconomics, Linear Algebra and Calculus is recommended.
- Assessment: Class attending and participation (10%), Presentation in class (15%), Problem Sets (15%), Final exam (open-book) (60%).

Topics proposal for Master Thesis (TFM)

- Topics related with behavioral economics, experimental economics, fairness, individual decision- making, behavioral finance, coordination problems.
- For instance my works under progress are on:
 - Inequalities and shocks in wealth,
 - Bank-runs as a coordination problem among depositors
 - Cheating, unethical behavior and delegation
 - Gender and collaboration
- Some possible proposals for TFM
 - Why inequalities occur and how people treat them?
 - Gender differences in behavior
